### PUPIL PREMIUM STRATEGY ALLOCATION OF FUNDING 2019-2020

#### Pupil Premium

The Pupil Premium Grant is allocated to children from low-income families who have been looked after continuously for more than six months, are currently known to be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) and those that have been eligible in the previous six years.

The money is allocated to initiatives to ensure pupils reach their full potential, academically, physically and socially. This strategy is shared and discussed with the Governing Board and will be reviewed in September 2020.

<p>Analysis of whole school and individual pupil's data has shown some common factors that are a barrier to pupil progress. We aim for this strategy to address / start addressing these things across this academic year. Here are some of the broader issues we have identified.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• At St Marys a high proportion (36%) of our PPG pupils have SEND and we aim to further challenge and narrow the gap between them and their peers nationally by accelerating individuals' progress with a focus on reading.</li><li>• 50% of Year 6 pupils are PPG. With such a large percentage, they will be a focus for this academic year.</li><li>• For pupils that are academically on track or more able, we aim to provide addition opportunities to enhance learning, wellbeing and outcomes.</li></ul> <p>Other helpful documents are our One Page Tracking Grids and PPG Pupil Tracking.</p>	

In **2019-20** the school received £97,680 of Pupil Premium funding.
