School is now open to Key Worker and Vulnerable children, with reception, nursery, year 1 and year 6 due to return over the course of this month.

First Aid:

See Accident and Incident Policy Covid 19 appendix.

Hirers, contractors and other visitors

The school premises will not be available for hire.

There will be no visitors to school unless they are invited in.

Deliveries are to be left at the front gate.

Contractors will be expected to work at weekends or when school is closed to children e.g. before and after the school day or when a room is empty. In an emergency e.g. electrical fault contractors will be required immediately and this may be during the school day.

All visitors will be expected to wear full PPE when on site. All visitors will be required to sign a waiver stating that they and any member of their family do not have any

symptoms of Covid 19. Any person unable to sign the waiver will not be allowed on site.

Classroom Safety:

Non fire doors will be kept open to minimise the risk of transmitting Covid 19 whilst inside the school. In the event of the fire alarm being activated all doors will be closed upon evacuating the building.

All classrooms will have a securely kept PPE pack, consisting of gloves, mask and apron, washing up liquid, hand wash, anti bac wipes, antibacterial spray, paper towels and hand sanitiser.

All children have their own zip wallet with their own resources.

Water Fountains:

All water fountains have been temporarily decommissioned and children should be supplied with their own water bottle from home.

Playground Equipment:

All large permanent playground equipment will be out of bounds. Every bubble will have their own playground equipment and it will be cleaned after each bubble has finished using it or more frequently.

Staff and children safety

Walkie talkies will be used by staff in the playground and classrooms when deemed necessary to contact a member of the SLT or school office to prevent unnecessary movement around the school.

Staff will be provided with PPE if required e.g. when dealing with an accident

Should staff request to wear PPE in situations not stated in government guidance e.g. in the PPA room, on the gate they will have to speak to their line manager and school will provide them with PPE.

Scooters and bikes:

Scooter and bikes cannot be left on the school premises. Parents and carers will need to take them back home with them.
