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<p>Maths</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">This half term:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Describe sequences of events. -Exploring numbers to 10. -Exploring 2D shape and patterns. -Positional language. -Exploring and comparing weight
<p>RE</p>	<p>Creation – What is so special about Easter?</p> <p>What This Unit Teaches:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -The events of Holy week, as celebrated by Christians, -That Christians believe Jesus died on a cross to show God’s love to the world, and that because of Jesus, everyone can be forgiven. -That Christians believe Jesus rose from the dead. -How Christians remember what happened at Easter and how they celebrate the festival of Easter
<p>PSED</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Help to find solutions to conflicts and rivalries. For example, accepting that not everyone can be Spider-Man in the game, and suggesting other ideas. -Increasingly follow rules, understanding why they are important. -What to do in school situations (example being hurt, feeling sad, feeling sick ect).
