#### Homework

Homework will be sent out every Friday and returned the following Thursday for marking.

### Reading

We expect that your child reads on a daily basis for 10-20 minutes and that you sign your child's reading log every day to say that they have done this. Please can you discuss the plot and characters as well as the meaning of new words the children read. This will help to develop comprehension skills. Please remember to re-read the whole sentence once a tricky word has been solved, this helps to develop fluency. Your child's home reading books need to be returned on **Fridays** so they can be changed.

### Times Tables

By the end of Year 4, children are expected to know all of their times tables (I-I2) off by heart and their related division facts.

For example:

 $2 \times 5 = 10$ 

 $5 \times 2 = 10$ 

 $10 \div 2 = 5$ 

 $10 \div 5 = 2$ 

Please ensure your child practises these times tables on a daily basis as part of their homework routine.

## Drinking water and Fruit

We encourage children to drink water throughout the day. Please ensure your child brings a **named** water bottle to school every day. Children are also encouraged to bring in a piece of fruit to eat at break time.

Finally, I would just like to remind you that the school gates open at 8.50am each morning and that your child should be settled in class by 9am when learning starts. Please remember that the school day ends at 3.30pm and that children must be collected on time. It is important that staff are able to prepare lessons and attend staff meetings directly after school; therefore, parents of children that are collected late will be fined £10.
